Purpose of SOE

- To compile and present everything your organization has done over the past calendar year
- To ensure your chapter is meeting and exceeding expectations
- ➤ To measure the impact of the fraternity/sorority community

Timeline

- ▶ Online forms: due November 1, 2019

- Presentation: November 12-15, 2019
 - ► In front of your council peers
 - One Executive Board member, One General Body member, One Newly Initiated member (from 2019)
 - ► Panel of judges: OFSL staff and campus partners
- Scores: January 2020

- 5 online forms (one per category)
 - Academic Excellence
 - Civic Engagement
 - Leadership Development
 - Positive Relationships
 - Risk Prevention Education
- Put time into ALL of them
 - ▶ Work on them in a word/Google doc, then copy and paste into form
- Split them up with your executive board
- ▶ Go over with OFSL Advisor in upcoming one-on-one

Question Bank

Scoring

- Scored out of 204 points, across the 6 sections
 - ► Not evenly weighted
 - Academic Excellence
 - Civic Engagement
 - ► Leadership Development
 - ► Positive Relationships
 - ► Risk Prevention Education
 - Presentation*

Star Grading

- Final grade at the end, based on how many points you get out of the total possible
- ▶ 5 Star Chapter: Admirable Achievements
- ▶ 4 Star Chapter: Commendable Achievements
- > 3 Star Chapter: Satisfactory
- 2 Star Chapter: Needs Improvement
- 1 Star Chapter: Unsatifactory

Category Levels

- In addition to Star Grade (5 Star Chapter, 4 Star, etc...)
- You will get a level score within each category (Levels 1-5)
- Will help give you context on how you do in each category
- Doesn't change anything or add more work for you
- Level 1: 20% of total possible points in a given category
- Level 2: 40% of total possible points in a given category
- Level 3: 60% of total possible points in a given category
- Level 4: 80% of total possible points in a given category
- Level 5: 100% of total possible points in a given category

Presentation Logistics

- Will take place week of November 12th
- ➤ 3 members of the chapter (One Executive Board member, One General Body member, One Newly Initiated member) will be given 10 minutes to creatively present an overview of their chapter
- > 3 panelists (OFSL staff and campus partners) will serve as judges and will ask questions at the end
- Peers from your council will also attend and complete an audience feedback form
- Your 3 members must attend the entire presentation block

Presentation Content

- ► This is a supplement to your submission
- Suggestions to include:
 - Visual aid
 - Photos
 - Areas you improved from 2018
 - > Strengths in 2019
 - Goals for 2019 and if you met them
 - Areas to improve for 2020
 - Points of pride

Things to Remember

- Everything is weighted differently so put effort into all sections
- Don't do it alone
- ► Think back to the spring & include everything
- Be honest- don't be afraid to share your weaknesses
- Work with your advisor

 - Designed to help you focus on the areas your chapter needs to improve upon
- Also applies for any chapter earning a chapter GPA below
 2.5 (fall & spring)
